Genesis 11:31-12:3

Terah took his son Abram and his grandson Lot son of Haran, and his daughter-in-law Sarai, his son Abram's wife, and they went out together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go into the land of Canaan; but when they came to Haran, they settled there. The days of Terah were two hundred five years; and Terah died in Haran.

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Call stories are some of my favorite stories in the Bible. Although every story is unique, I am always intrigued by God's request that someone take a leap of faith and drastically change their life. I have to admit that sometimes I'm envious when I read these stories. I think about how amazing it would be to hear God speak that directly to me and to choose me for something so important.

When I catch myself thinking like that, there are two things of which I like to remind myself: (1) Dropping everything to follow God isn't easy—even if you get to take your family with you and even if you know where you're going. Giving up that much control over my life would be incredibly difficult. And (2) God *has* chosen me for something important; God has called everyone for something important, and we are all called to contribute to God's kingdom in our own ways.

Furthermore, God will call us to different things at different times. At this point in my life, I feel called to work toward everyone having access to good health care regardless of their financial capability. Years from now, the way I feel called to help God's people through my career may be different. And I know God has, and will continue, to call me to contribute to God's kingdom outside of my day job.

What do you hear God calling you to do?

Music Notes

Easter is late this year. As I write this in the latter part of March, the moon is just about full—it will be full tomorrow right on the spring equinox. But the paschal full moon must come *after* the equinox, so Easter has to wait. That means I have more

time to get ready, hurray!

How we determine the date of Easter is a long story, rooted in our Jewish history as well as several centuries of fruitful debate in the early church. Not surprisingly, I agree with the system we have inherited in the west. Like so many things we have inherited, they don't make 'em like that anymore!

My work as a musician is directly impacted by decisions made while the Roman Empire was still going strong. All of us can say the same: how the church is decorated, what we wear, when we celebrate, a lot of it was determined during the time of the Caesars.

I love the *Old Farmer's Almanac*. My oldest copy dates to 1845, and it's amazing how little it's changed, except for all the advertisements. But all of the obscure technicalities which the Almanac provides—the Golden Number, Dominical Letter, epact—all relate to the date of Easter. This is all part of the *computus*, the figuring of that all-important date.

Does it matter? Yes, actually, it does. The Christian faith was foretold in the Old Testament, and the feast of unleavened bread—the Passover—finds its fulfillment in the "unleavened bread of sincerity and truth," the feast of the New Law. The two testaments are entwined by the fulfillment of one in the other, in one long history—really, a symphony—of human salvation. As the Passover was (and still is) observed on the 14th of Nisan, under a full moon, so Easter is on the Sunday following the full moon, not of Nisan but of the spring equinox. As an incarnational faith, our Christianity blooms in the divine petri dish of time and space.

Turns out Easter is right on time after all.




Make a celebration snack!


You need:

- * 4 boxes of gelatin dessert in any flavor (4-serving size)
- & Boiling water
- **%** 9" x 13" pan
