Psalm 63

*O God, you are my God, I seek you,
my soul thirsts for you;

*I heard the voice of Jesus say,
“Behold, I freely give
the living water, thirsty one;
stoop down and drink and live.”
I came to Jesus, and I drank
of that life-giving stream;
my thirst was quenched, my soul revived,
and now I live in him.*

Wilderness wandering. That's how I've always thought of Lent; a period in the desert before receiving the fresh, cool water of Easter. But wandering in the desert means you get tired and weary and so, so thirsty. Jesus himself uttered those words as he neared the end of his desert journey: "I thirst."

Psalms 63 describes our wandering as thirsting for God. Our whole being longs for God "in a dry and parched land where there is no water." Walter Brueggemann reiterates this idea by saying, "The theme of wilderness is an appropriate one for Lent, for Lent is about being in thin places without resources and being driven back to the elemental reality of God, the reliability of God, and our capacity to trust God in the thin places where there are no other resources. The Bible does not everywhere assume that God is present, but knows about the dry places where God's absence is overwhelming."

Our dry places are not always immediately evident to us. Sometimes we avoid visiting those dry places and wandering through our deserts by treating Lent like a task to check off our lists: don't eat chocolate for forty days, don't watch TV, don't . . . don't . . . don't. But what if we *do*? What if we do the hard work of desert-wandering that lies before us? What if we dig deep and think about the dry places in our lives where God's absence feels overwhelming? God promises a life-giving stream at the end of our journey, water miraculously gushing from the rock.

UPDATE ON CORONAVIRUS

The Church Session met the evening of March 16 on a conference call to discuss the current situation. We talked about the best ways to both protect and support each other during this time. These are some of the decisions the Session came to:

- Unfortunately, it is now clear that this crisis is not going away anytime soon. The Session has made a decision to suspend in-person activities, meetings and worship services until April 19th. We will continue to assess the situation regularly and provide updates as the situation develops. Our first priority has to be the safety of our congregation.
- We are going to step up electronic communications. We are looking at possibilities for on-line worship and fellowship experiences. Stay tuned for more details.
- Elders and Deacons will be reaching out to congregants to make sure they're doing OK.

Finally, no one knows what the future holds and we don't have many global health care experts in our midst, so the best advice on this from a health perspective will come from the link below.

We are, however, a Christian Community and as such, we are the best people to support each other in this time of need. The situation has real concerns, but we will fare better if we remain in community, even though we are temporarily not physically meeting.

Memorial Pavers

To order a memorial paver to honor or remember your loved ones, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is only \$100. We will place an order when we have 10 requests (as of now we only have one order).

Only 4 Niches Remain Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options:

Payment in Full = \$2,800

12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000)

18-Month Payment Option = \$180 / month for 18 months (\$3,240)

We will need to consider constructing a 2nd and 3rd columbarium wall soon...

The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$40,000+.



You need:


- ✿ 4 boxes of gelatin dessert in any flavor (4-serving size)
