Faith Matters

"When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb." (*Mark 16:1-2*)

Dear friends,

I want to thank you all for your support as I've been at home recovering from a broken leg and sprained ankles. It has been a challenging month, to be sure, but one made better by your gifts of love. I especially want to thank our worship leaders for the last month: Anne Wood, Bill Powers, Duncan Nichol, and Peter Surgenor. Stepping in, as they did, to offer the Word and lead the congregation in worship when I was unable to do so was a true act of kindness. I will be forever grateful.

I am not yet fully recovered as yet, but I am much improved. The doctor has given me permission to return to my pastoral duties on a limited basis. However, I am still not able to drive. So, my plan is to be with you on Sunday mornings and to work from home the other days, making use of modern technology to stay in touch and participate in meetings. I will, however, remain clear of stairs (still not my friend) and will be limited in standing. I trust that God will give the strength I need to accomplish my ministry tasks and that we will be together again for worship very soon.

Our Holy Week worship schedule is similar to that of last year, although there will be no dawn service on Easter. I apologize for that, but I simply won't be able to lead two services on Easter. That said, there *will* be 9:30am worship on both Palm Sunday and Easter, as well as 7:00pm worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We will share together in communion on both Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday. And I hope you'll plan to join us.

You may recall that when I started serving the Goshen church two years ago, just before Easter, I invited you to reflect upon the power of the resurrection to *change the world*.

Change has always been a part of the story of Christian believers—right down to the change thrust upon the earliest disciples when they discover that Jesus' prediction of his rising has been fulfilled. The Gospel of Mark shares the story of the women who first encounter the empty tomb. They had come to prepare Jesus' breathless body for a proper burial, having brought spices to cover up the stench of a death. But upon their arrival, they discover that not only has the sun risen on this new day, but the Son has risen, too. Their beloved Jesus is no longer confined by death but has risen to new life—just as he said he would. And the women are called to be tellers of the Word—"apostles" sent by Jesus to announce the resurrection.

This is our work, too—to be tellers of the Word. And while announcing resurrection is always vital, it is never so vital as during a time when change is thrust upon us.

Your Pastor Nominating Committee has begun their very important work of seeking a new pastor and, before too long, you will begin a new day in ministry. And, as no two pastors come to the ministry with precisely the same gifts, talents, skills, and passions, you will experience a change. But this change is not to be feared. Rather, it is to be *respected* for the good it brings and *welcomed* for the energy it brings to those who choose life, welcome change, and covenant to serve Christ anew. We see in the resurrection of our Lord the promise of newness: a new day, a new Way, a new manner of loving and serving the One whom death could not contain. And may that promise bring us joy and lead us to continued faithfulness!

My friends, trust that change is not something to be feared for change has always been a part of the story of the Church. And while it may seem risky to welcome change, embodying Christ for a new era is the mark of our choosing to fulfill our calling to serve the Lord, make disciples, and spread the good news that Christ our Lord does make all things new—even a congregation with many years of history. Friends, like the women, let us run forth and share the message of resurrection. Happy Easter!

One Great Hour of Sharing

In a world where disaster, hunger and oppression loom on a daily basis, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education and opportunity. For over 70 years, the Presbyterian Mission Agency has taken an annual special offering to meet the needs of those affected by wars, poverty, natural disasters and more. Starting with an Easter call from the pulpit to help rebuild Europe following World War II in "One Great Hour of Sharing," the special offering has raised millions to bring peace, healing, and compassion into those places throughout the world where the need is great. The congregation will be asked to consider making a special gift on Easter Sunday to the One Great Hour of Sharing offering. And Fish Banks will be distributed to our Sunday School children (and others, too) to share something of our bounty with those whom the world is often inclined to disregard. The fish is representative of Jesus' miracle of feeding the thousands with a small amount of fish and bread. When Presbyterians give, we can feed and support thousands, too. Putting a fish bank on your kitchen table, or somewhere your family regularly meets, and adding some coins every day is a great opportunity for an object lesson on how we can share some of what we have with others who have very little. Your support is greatly appreciated.



Easter is approaching, and the choir and handbell choir are hard at work preparing music for you. I'm also at work with the children, teaching them something to (eventually!) sing with the adult choir. There will be more information as soon as dates can be decided with Religious Ed.

The final edits to the organ project are still pending. I will update you as soon as I have updates. Easter is a busy time for organ builders—sort of like tax season for

an accountant. Still, I have asked for updates and will gently persist.

I've been reading a book by Chateaubriand, in full François-René de Chateaubriand, a French aristocrat and writer who lived from 1768 to 1848. He saw the French Revolution, largely from exile; at his death, France was still racked with unrest. Today's academic world, hopelessly bogged down in political theories, has slapped him with the label of "paranoid reactionary." On actually reading him, I prefer the terms "genius" and "Christian." In fact, speaking of a Christian genius, the book I'm reading is titled *The Genius of Christianity*! He wrote it in 1802 and it's still timely today.

Chateaubriand wrote this masterpiece during the flood tide of atheism that came with the so-called "Enlightenment" or "Age of Reason"—as in *guillotines*—and it is a brilliant defense of the Christian faith. After showing both the reasonability and factuality of the faith—the defensible truth of God's existence and incarnation, Christ's resurrection, all of it—he points out the great benefits the church brought to a world adrift after the fall of Rome. He shows what Christianity has done for the arts, the sciences, and the ordering of society. I can't recommend the book enough: find it for free on archive.org.

Best of all, though, is his advice for dealing with atheistic elites. Don't reason with them, he says: they don't care, they won't listen, they don't even believe their own words, and all they want is to hear their own voice and acquire power. Instead of arguing till you're "blue in the face," go around after them and undo the damage, one wounded soul at a time. In other words, just keep telling the truth, and you'll unravel their ill-woven tapestry.

It sounds kind of fun, actually.

My old friend from the University of Chicago, Algis Valiunas, published a great article on Chateaubriand in the December 2022 issue of *National Review*. I highly recommend it, and everything else Algis has written.

It's nice to know, as a church musician, that people "out there" still strongly support the culture that makes my work possible. Thank you for that, too...and enjoy another spring!

Regarding the Children's Message: We keep the camera zoomed out. As children leave to go to Sunday school, we will pan up to the stained glass windows so no children's faces are caught on camera.




