Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Well, once again, time has come around its circle, and the end of the year begins its settling in. Autumn is full upon us, the leaves of the trees have finished their work and have ended their lives in a burst of color and a windblown fall to the ground. The air is cool all day now, and the fields are ready for harvesting, thanks to a lush and fruitful summer. The insects have already ended their nightly songs, except for a lone one or two who continue their trills to the very end. The gardens are done, the mowers are put away, we've reluctantly found our winter coats, and we know, deep in our bones, that now is the settling-in time.

Though we are a busy congregation, busier perhaps than any other generation that has worshiped and worked within these church walls, we are also the generation that is most disconnected from our natural world. And the reason is that, other than keeping an eye on the weather to know how it will affect our plans or our commute or our children's school schedule, we rarely pay attention to our world. Not being farmers or those who must cleave our daily meals from the earth by our own hands, we have become disconnected from this sacred presence and gift. It's quite easy to do. And yet, deep within each of us, connected somewhere in the ancient rhythms of our blood, that ocean of life that flows through our veins from the beginning of time, we know and can feel the change of the seasons within us. Given time and space, we slow down and know that now is the time to gather in, to allow our energies to come home from the many far-flung paths on which they have been all summer.

Like the earth, we reflect the sacred connection to God that was given to us as soon as that holy breath filled our lungs. As God breathes in us, so we breathe. And that life breath has a rhythm that connects us with all that is deep and strong and life sustaining. The change of seasons is one of those long moments when we can see it, feel it, and, if we are able, let it guide us. For the breath of God is wisdom for all of us. Even if we cannot live a life fully connected to our created world, we can let God's wisdom fill us by allowing ourselves to receive the gift of this changing time. We can know it, engage in it, and make room for it in our lives. We can let it teach us, season by season, about the rhythm of life, of being and doing, resting and gathering in.

Augustine once wrote that nature is God's Big Book of Scripture, the wisdom of God writ large, while the Bible is God's small book. Let's take time to read, ponder, and gather in so that, come spring, our roots are deeply fed and watered, ready for new leaves that will grace the trees that now stand bare. Autumn is not an ending; rather, it is a fulfilling of the promise. It is a time to savor, taste, and breathe deeply.

Please come and join with us in song, word, and sacrament as we experience this wonderful time of year. The choir is strong and preparing for a blessed Advent and Christmas season of 2009.



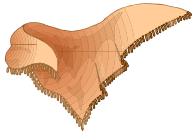

News of the Prayer Shawl Ministry (PSM)

We start this month's news by welcoming Elfriede Johnson to our group. We can always use extra hands to make the shawls, as we have become very popular in many communities. We are sure Elfriede will be turning out shawls like the rest of us.

We recently donated five lap robes to The Valley View Center for Nursing Care and Rehabilitation in Goshen for their wheelchair patients. Also, we will soon be taking more shawls to the maternity unit of Orange Regional Medical Center in Middletown. They give them to new mothers that have seriously ill newborns or stillborn births. We took some about a year ago, and, sadly, they are in need of more. Apparently, hugs from shawls during these sad times seem to let them know that someone cares.

Our first thank-you book is filled to capacity, and we are going to have to start a second binder. The letters and cards are very moving, and the gifts are so very appreciated by the receivers. Remember, if you know someone in need of a hug, stop by the church office, and our wonderful secretary, Pat, will guide you to the supply of shawls and lap robes. You can pick a folder and choose a prayer or two to give with the gift. We have several new prayers in our box now, so pick and choose what you feel is appropriate for the receiver.

We are again in need of gift bags, so if you have some gently-used ones at home that you can part with, we would welcome them. We have a supply of tissue paper, but we will always accept more to wrap the shawls inside the gift bags.

Our members have also made scarves, mittens, and other things needed for the Christmas Giving Tree. This is a fine way to use up the small quantities of leftover yarns. We don't want to see any of our yarn go to waste. Remember, too, that if you want to help this ministry continue, we are more than grateful for gift cards for stores that sell yarn. We thank you in advance for this.

Payment in Full = \$2,500
12-Month Payment Option = \$255/month for 12 months
24-Month Payment Option = \$125/month for 24 months
36-Month Payment Option = \$90/month for 36 months
