"Faith Matters"

For You shaped me, inside and out. You knitted me together in my mother's womb *long before I took my first breath*. I will offer You my grateful heart, for I am Your *unique* creation, filled with wonder and awe. (*Psalm 139:13-14a The Voice*)

My soul lifts up the Lord! My spirit celebrates God, my Liberator! For though I'm God's humble servant, God has noticed me. (*Luke 1:46-48 The Voice*)

I have traveled many moonless nights, cold and weary with a babe inside. And I wonder what I've done. Holy Father, you have come and chosen me now to carry your son. I am waiting in silent prayer. I am frightened by the load I bear. In a world as cold as stone, must I walk this path alone? Be with me now. Breath of heaven, hold me together, be forever near me. Lighten my darkness, pour over me your holiness. For you are holy, Breath of heaven. *(Breath of Heaven, Chris Eaton and Amy Grant, 1992)*

My dear friends in Christ,

The Bible is a rich trove of songs offered up in praise of God. In Psalm 139, King David sings in awe of the marvelous gift of life he's been given. I love the lyrics of verse 14 from *The Voice* translation, above, but the *New Revised Standard Version* speaks of David's intimate relationship with the great Creator in words that are equally meaningful: *I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.*

David's words may seem odd to the modern ear. But when he describes himself as having been *fearfully made* by the hand of God, he's speaking with reverence for the Holy One. He sings, in astonishment, of the gift of an intimate relationship with the One who breathed life into him and made him a *unique creation*. David welcomes God's call to save the Hebrew people from the violent forces that threaten to darken the world. And, as one who is set apart by God to do holy work, David's resilient voice can be heard ringing out into that darkness, singing boldly to the Lord, *"even the darkness is not dark to you."*

As the days grow shorter and the darkness of the winter night seems an ever-encroaching presence, it's a gift to know that God has formed us to be unique, resilient, and purposeful creations, too.

While David's purpose is to be a king who will free his people from bondage and lead them into a wondrous and saving relationship with their God, Mary's purpose is to grow the Holy One in her womb and give birth to a Savior. But she *is* a young woman—a teenager, really—from a simple family

without status or wealth. She's betrothed to an older man, but not yet married. When she replies to the angel, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word," she's committing herself to a life that is unique but not without difficulty.

In saying "Yes" to God, Mary accepts the burden of being an unwed mother, even though such a "distinction" could result in her being shunned or, worse yet, killed once her condition becomes known. So, why *would* she say "Yes" to God? Like David, she's grateful to be shown favor by God and given an opportunity to serve the Lord in a meaningful way. There's an intimacy with God that is underscored in both these Biblical characters; each understands that, while the road before them will not be an easy one, the destination is God-intended and well worth the effort.

I hear a bit of this nuanced understanding of call and purpose in the lyrics of one of my favorite Christmas songs, "Breath of Heaven" by Amy Grant. While honored to serve as mother to Jesus, Mary is young and vulnerable. In an often cold and harsh world, she chooses to honor her covenant with God nonetheless, and does so praising the Lord while also confessing her need for strength and resilience as the threat of becoming a social outcast grows greater with each passing month—and trimester.

These stories give us powerful evidence that the Creator, who knit us in our mother's wombs, too, has a purpose for our lives—that of sharing the light of Christ through word and deed, trusting that: the darkness is not dark to God, the Spirit is brilliantly at work making us resilient in the face of every challenge, and the call of Christ has been breathed into us as children of our precious Savior. And, whether we experience that call to serve as a soft whisper or a momentous shout, may we trust that, like Mary, we have "found favor" with God and are invited to say "Yes" to serving a holy purpose.

This Advent, we will look at Mary's story in a Zoom study on Monday evenings. Using the book, *Not a Silent Night* by Adam Hamilton, we will talk about this faithful woman who, like David before her, was *"fearfully and wonderfully made."* If you would like to join the group, email me at: revrhon@aol.com

Thank you, once again, for the privilege of serving as your Interim Pastor, dear Friends. And may God bless us all with an awe-inspiring and purposeful Advent as we, too, grow in intimacy with our Savior.

I've been reading a wonderful book by an English professor in Rhode Island named Anthony Esolen. Titled *Nostalgia*, it is a penetrating and deeply reflective study of that idea. Esolen's point is that nostalgia, for a Christian, is not for a specific place in the past, or a cherished memory. Those things are beautiful, but they are meant to point us to our true home...*where we have never yet been*. In other words, we are nostalgic for *heaven*. Neither the past nor the (imagined) future are to be condemned or idolized; both lead us to the eternal Present.

The book is beautifully written, lyrical and literary, and draws on the *Odyssey* as a metaphor for the modern search for meaning. Highly recommended.

Memorial Pavers

To order a memorial paver to honor or remember your loved ones, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is only \$100. We will place an order when we have 10 requests (as of now we have **FIVE** orders).

Only 3 Niches Remain Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options: **Payment in Full = \$2,800** 12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000) 18-Month Payment Option = \$180 / month for 18 months (\$3,240)

We will need to consider constructing a 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} columbarium wall soon. The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$40,000+.



Bake "Stained-Glass" Cookies 1. Mix your favorite cutout cookie recipe. 2. Chill overnight. 3. On waxed paper, roll dough into thin ropes, about 6" long. 4. Shape ropes into holiday symbols - stars, bells, etc. 5. Crush hard candies to make 2 cups. 6. Place shapes on wellgreased cookie sheets. 7. Fill the openings with hard candies. 8. Use a toothpick to poke a hole in the top of each if you want to hang them. 9. Bake for 8 minutes, or until candy melts. 10. Cool completely before removing from cookie sheet. **11.** Tie a loop of thread through hole if desired.
