The Doldrums (or February)

. . . if anything is excellent or praiseworthy, think about such things (Philippians 4:8)

One of the most riveting sections of Laura Hillenbrand's *Unbroken* is the story of Louis Zamperini's forty-six days adrift at sea following the crash of the aircraft on which he was serving during World War II. Louis was stranded at sea in an inflatable raft with two others who survived the crash.

Somewhere around day thirty-four "they woke to a strange stillness." There was not the slightest hint of breeze; the ocean appeared solidly calm. It was "an experience of transcendence." They had found the "doldrums – that eerie pause of wind and water that lingers around the equator."

For a while they spoke, sharing their wonder. Then they fell into reverent silence. Their suffering was suspended. They weren't hungry or thirsty. They were unaware of the approach of death. As he watched this beautiful still world Louis played with a thought that had come to him before . . . such beauty he thought was too perfect to have come about by mere chance.

Remarkably, stranded at sea and in the final stages of starvation, Zamperini experienced that day in the Pacific as a gift. Hillenbrand adds that the men were "joyful and grateful in the midst of slow dying."

The *Webster's New World Dictionary* defines "doldrums" as "low spirits; dull, gloomy, listless feeling." While it is not a word we use regularly it is a word that we know and for many it happens to us around January and February. The doldrums speak to an inner deadness, the absence of passion and zeal. To use Hillenbrand's words, our doldrums are a "slow dying" inwardly.

You may know the doldrums all too well. You may be there today. Things that were once enjoyable or pleasurable no longer are so. Likewise, that which once incited indignation or outrage no longer stirs the slightest protest. However, even in the doldrums, there is beauty to be seen and joy to be known.

To read Paul's letter to the Philippians is to read the words of a man who is "joyful and grateful in the midst of slow dying." Paul wrote this letter while waiting on a verdict; he was anticipating a possible death sentence. Paul was eventually delivered from this imprisonment – but as he wrote, his life was on the line. In the face of death he wrote of the peace of God, the experience of joy, the absence of worry.

Perhaps he was able to do this because of what he did with his mind. Whatever was true or noble or lovely or excellent or worthy of praise – those were the things he thought about. He told the Philippians to do the same. "Think on these things." The result of this intentional thinking is the experience of God's peace.

Your thoughts matter. If you find yourself in the doldrums, they matter a great deal. Even there we can know something transcendent. We can be joyful and grateful people.

On Sunday, February 10 we remember the Transfiguration of the Lord in which Jesus and three of his apostles go to a mountain, and Jesus begins to shine with bright rays of light. Then, the prophets Moses and Elijah appear next to him and he speaks with them. He shows his disciples a glimpse of his heavenly glory.

We move immediately to an early **Ash Wednesday** on February 13. It is at this time we stop to reflect upon our mortal condition and to hear those words, “Remember, from dust you are and to dust you shall return.” We come with penitent hearts indicating our desire to search our hearts and change our lives. We humble ourselves and receive the ashes in the shape of a cross on our foreheads reminding us of the good news of the gospel – forgiveness for all and life in Christ.

We leave and go back out into the world ready to do our soul searching in a positive way taking stock of our lives, our shortcomings, our separation from God and his will for our lives. It is during this time that we can make changes in how we live in relationship with ourselves and with others. The season of Lent is a time to set things right.

Our chancel choir will be supporting our Lenten journey with appropriate anthems to help us along the way. On Ash Wednesday we offer this sung prayer as we join together in humility and partake of the communion commemorating Christ’s suffering on our behalf. “Do this in remembrance of me.”

*Search me, O God, and know my heart today;
Try me, O Savior, know my thoughts, I pray.
See if there be some wicked way in me;
Cleanse me from every sin and set me free.*

*Lord, take my life, and make it wholly thine;
Fill my poor heart with thy great love divine.
Take all my will, my passion, self and pride;

Payment in Full = \$2,500

12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000)

24-Month Payment Option = \$130 / month for 24 months (\$3,120)

36-Month Payment Option = \$ 90 / month for 36 months (\$3,240)


BIBLICAL BRAIN TEASER

The Souper Bowl

On Super Bowl Sunday tens of millions of people will enjoy the warmth of friendship and the satisfaction of food and drink while watching the Super Bowl football game on television. Unfortunately, at the same time, countless other people will feel cold air against their flesh and hunger within their stomachs.

An effort has been born that seeks to transform the Super Bowl into a “**Souper Bowl**” for the needy. The “**Souper Bowl**” is a unique interdenominational effort to glorify God and care for our brothers and sisters in need.

Here’s how it works: please give one dollar & one canned good as you leave worship on the weekend of the Super Bowl.

Youth from your congregation will collect the money and canned goods and then send the contributions DIRECTLY to the Goshen Ecumenical Pantry. Congregations across the nation are then asked to call “**Souper Bowl**” headquarters with the results of their efforts so that totals can be promptly determined and released. Here’s some background: the effort began in a Columbia, SC church in 1990. That year \$5,700 was raised in Columbia. Last Year 10,461 congregations across the nation raised \$9,873,670. **The Goshen Ecumenical Food Pantry raised \$2,192.17.**
