"Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love." (1 John 4:8 NRSV)

"Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you." (*Philippians 4:9*)

Dear Friends in Christ,

A new year begins, and with it comes opportunities to Renew our faith. One way we hope to achieve Renewal is through worship. The report we received after the completion of our Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) last summer indicated that a good number of us would like to participate in services that are in some way different from the usual Sunday morning fare. So, we will be offering family-friendly worship on the 3rd Sunday evening of most months for the year 2022. Each service will have a theme and will explore alternative worship styles. (There may be a few services that are not so family oriented; we will let you know of these ahead of time, as the planning takes shape.)

For January, our service will be held on the weekend we honor the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Gathering in the sanctuary at 5pm on Sunday, January 16th, we will share in worship around themes of peace, justice and love. Using *song, story, and prayer*, we will lift up the call of Christ to love our neighbors and be peacemakers in his name.

Dr. King understood that the way to address matters of racism and inequality in our nation was to make productive changes in the way we live as individuals within a broader community. Recognizing that such changes do not come about in a void, nor through violence, King tutored under Mahatma Ghandi and learned methods of peaceful intervention which he believed sprang from the deep pool of love which God imparts upon human hearts.

Dr. King once said, "Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." Hatred is a breeding ground for anger, resentment and violence. Hatred also leads to a path of destruction and suffering, which is why King chose another path: "I have decided to stick with love....Hate is too great a burden to bear."

As Christians, we resonate with Dr. King and his ministry because we believe that love is a defining characteristic of God. And we believe that God would want us to receive and share that gift of love by welcoming and modeling the Spirit of peace.

Many years ago, I had the privilege of working for Children's Songwriter and Folk Music Artist Red Grammar. At the time, Red had just released his "Teaching Peace" album and I was delighted to offer my support. Red moved from Sugar Loaf to California quite some time ago, but I've heard him perform several times over the years and his message has never faltered. These are a few of his song lyrics:

Teaching peace all the world around, You and me every city every town; One by one in our work and in our play, We are teaching peace by what we do and what we say. It's up to us to show we care. Reaching out to everybody everywhere; Heart to heart and friend to friend, Circling all around the world and back again.

Red sings it. Dr. King preached it. And we know it to be true: peace is an outgrowth of love and care. And when we work for peace, and "do justice" as the prophet Micah emphasized, we share the love of God in ways that confess the true value of "everybody everywhere." I hope you can join us on January 16th.

Looking ahead, our February 20th evening service will include a Renewal of Vows celebration in honor of Valentine's Day. And our March 20th evening service will honor Mr. Fred Rogers (a Presbyterian pastor and t.v. host whose birthday fell in March) with an emphasis on Neighboring. I hope you'll join us!

Memorial Pavers

To order a memorial paver to honor or remember your loved ones, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is only \$100. We will place an order when we have 10 requests (as of now we have **FIVE** orders).

Only 3 Niches Remain Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options: **Payment in Full = \$2,800** 12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000) 18-Month Payment Option = \$180 / month for 18 months (\$3,240)

We will need to consider constructing a 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} columbarium wall soon. The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$40,000+.


