Faith Matters

"For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." (*Ecclesiastes 3:1, NRSVue*)

My Dear Goshen Presbyterian Friends and Family,

I hope this letter finds you well and I hope, too, that your Christmas holiday was a lovely one. It is still my joy to be a part of this wonderful faith community, and I hope you feel likewise about my participation with the church.

As you know, the Transition Team's Report has been approved by the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) and the congregation's nominating committee is at work putting together a slate of church members to recommend to you for service on an upcoming Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Once our general nominating committee has agreed on a slate of active members to present to you for service on the PNC, they will share that slate with the Session along with a request that a special congregational meeting be called to elect that PNC.

Once the PNC has been elected, neither the Session nor the interim pastor nor the at-large members of the congregation have a role in determining who will be the next pastor **until the PNC is ready to present its nominee to you for a vote.** The presbytery has asked the Rev. Judy Anderson of the Florida church to serve as their representative to the PNC, being available to them to offer guidance and support, and to evaluate the nominee that the PNC selects to be presented to you for vote. It is part of our Presbyterian polity that the presbytery is authorized to be *partners* in this discernment process.

And, once elected, the PNC will write up a Ministry Information Form (MIF), largely based upon the Transition Team's Report, and establish criteria by which to determine which candidates they feel would be a good match for the Goshen church. The MIF, once approved by the presbytery, will be shared with church headquarters in Louisville and it will be added to the database of the Church Leadership Connection of the PC(USA)'s Office of Vocations. Before too long, Personal Information Forms (PIFs) from pastors seeking a new call will be forwarded to our PNC for review. This can be a fairly lengthy process, I warn you. So, I ask that you:

- Keep the PNC in your prayers;
- Exercise patience in awaiting their updates;

- Support the decisions they make on your behalf; and
- Do not put undue influence on the PNC to call "a certain type" of pastor.

Let God be the One to lead the PNC in their work. Agendas or preferences have no place in the call processes of our Presbyterian churches.

This is an exciting time for the church and I know I can count on you to prayerfully support the Pastor Nominating Committee you will soon elect. Once a date has been set for the special congregational meeting to elect the PNC, we will announce it on social media and during announcements at worship. So, "keep an ear out."

Let us share in prayers for a blessed new year!


Book Study Starting January 23rd
