HUG HAPPENINGS – Summer 2010

As many of you read in the Independent Republican, we gave out shawl (gift) number five hundred on Mother's Day. How wonderful that our small group decided to do "**Shawls for Soldiers.**" We decided that we should keep a few red, white, and blue ones on hand in case we need to give one to a member of a military family. The need arises when we least expect it.

On May 25, Darlene Bartley and I had the honor of meeting author Debbie Macomber in New Jersey at a book signing. Not only did we get our books autographed (she wrote some lovely words to us), but we were also given the opportunity to sit privately with her and her editors from New York City and Toronto and to have coffee and pastries. We presented her with a porcelain rose pin in the shape of a heart from our ministry, and we gave her a copy of the Independent Republican with the "Story of the Shawls" to take back to the state of Washington with her. We told her editors how we began our prayer shawl ministry and how the book *Back on Blossom Street* was inspiring to our group. They were so gracious and kind to a couple of fans. We suggested to the editors that if she ever wants to do a book signing in the Northeast, we know of a **GREAT** Presbyterian Church that would open its doors for her. Darlene and I were smiling all the way home. It was a thrill to meet her in person, and we will never forget it.

- *"Thank you so much for the beautiful shawl and the prayers. It meant a lot to know we have so many people thinking about Emily and her recovery as well as her family. Thank you again."* (Barbara Berry)
- (To Nancy Mason from a dear friend) *"What a wonderful thing you and your Mom have done for me!! At this time, I needed a "hug"!!! It was such a nice surprise and couldn't have come at a better time. The shawl is beautiful and so very soft. Thank you, to both of you."* (Jane in Oklahoma)
- *"Thank you so much for the beautiful prayer shawl. I am getting lots of hugs from it. It has been very comforting to me when I wear it and I know it came with love and prayer. It has meant so much to me."* (Kim, who is from Warwick and is recovering from surgery)

As you read these comments, you will feel the love that we are sending from our church to those who need some comforting. Often, if I know that the person has a long recovery ahead, I include with the shawl the Debbie Macomber book that started us in our ministry, so that person has something to read during recovery. It seems that it is always appreciated. Again, thank you to everyone who donates yarn or gift cards to our group so we can continue sending our gifts. We haven't settled on a new meeting time yet, but each of us continues to crochet at home. Remember, if you need a gift of a shawl, Pat can direct you to the shawl room to get one. We have a good supply currently on hand.
