Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The other night, my family and I went out for dinner as the wind was howling and the trees were swaying like hula dancers. Undaunted, we enjoyed our meal and made our way back home as the winds were subsiding. Pulling into our driveway we were greeted by a large "hula dancer" laying on its side in our back yard. Its placement was nothing but amazing. For one thing, it did not touch our house or the garden shed. The arch of the trunk even kept it off the newly sprouting patch of grass I had been babying. Others in the area were not as fortunate. We have all seen damage and destruction from the wrath of Mother Nature.

Psalm 121:7 says that the Lord will keep you from all harm. When trees fall on houses we have to wonder about this. It simply doesn't sound true. Does it sound nice? Yes. True? Not so much.

It's no consolation that the tree went down on someone else's house. And while we can be thankful when no one is physically hurt, the trouble is still real and the threat of injury is no less present. Most of us have enough life experience to ask hard questions about Psalm 121:7.

Eugene Peterson explores the meaning of Psalm 21 in his fine volume, "*A Long Obedience in the Same Direction.*" Peterson makes this remark about verse 7. "All the water in all the oceans cannot sink a ship unless it gets inside. Nor can all the trouble in the world harm us unless it gets within us." Psalm 121 does not promise that life will be trouble free or unscathed by pain. What it says is that God will not allow that trouble to be the defining last word on your life. None of it can separate you from his good purposes for you.

This past weekend our attention turned to our Fathers. What I know as a dad is that I'm inclined to make promises that I cannot keep. I want to promise my children Psalm 121:7 – that I will keep them from all harm. I know I can't do that. We've made enough trips to the emergency room and wiped enough tears to know that we cannot shield them from sharper edges of life in this world. But I also know that when the sharp edges cut and draw blood, the fact that they are my children doesn't change. That they are loved does not change. And so it is with you, children of the Heavenly Father.

All the water of all the oceans cannot sink a ship unless it gets inside. God may not keep the trouble from coming to you, but he will keep it from getting inside you. It does not define who you are. Instead, God fills you with his Spirit, his very life.

The trees may come down. God remains faithful.
