I'd like to thank the choir for its excellent work. You have probably noticed how strongly our music ministers are singing, projecting a good spirit, and supporting worship. This has to do with their personal dedication and love, and their faithful attendance—as much as their circumstances allow—at choir practice.

Thanks as well to the Emmaus Ringers as they conclude another successful year of music and enjoyment. All the same praise applies.

Thanks too for all the support you give this good ministry.

The practice of any serious art form teaches one that technique and expression, the means and the goal, are united much like body and soul. Yet, if I've learned anything from years of teaching music theory, it's that no theory can exhaust the meaning of the music. At the end of the study, the practice, the preparations, is the *experience*. Nothing can fully explain this, yet it makes all the hard work worthwhile.

The organ is still awaiting a final visit from Austin—but I'm not going to hold back! Something new is on the horizon. Look for a trial series of noontime recitals. Let's see if we can entice local people to come at lunchtime to hear some music, at least one day a week. At the start, I envision organ music, but that may grow to include other instruments over time. We'll have to see how it develops...what sort of response we get.

Forgive me if I sound like Yogi Berra, but *the future of sacred music is the same as it's always been*. An ancient hymn sings of the "sober intoxication of the Holy Spirit," a musical expression that brings joy and communion, clarity and peace—not the "noisy gong or clanging cymbal" that we too often associate with "lively music." Lively music is music that gives *life*, that weakens vice and grows virtue, that points a way past the restlessness and rage, the accusations and excuses, the superficiality and sadness, that seem so inescapable. There is a way forward—it is *the* Way, Christ Himself—and the music we sing grows from that faith.

As we reach another moment of endings and beginnings, let's remember what continues. As we reach another summer, let's take time to relax. Always, let's be thankful for the gift of music—that amazing art that grows from the physics of God's own creation, a hidden gem for us to discover and facet, a treasure and an heirloom and an old familiar friend.

If you would rather stay out of camera range, please know that we do not capture the seating under the balcony (on either side) and we don't capture the back rows at all. Regarding the Children's Message: We keep the camera zoomed out. As children leave to go to Sunday school, we will pan up to the stained glass windows so no children's faces are caught on camera.
