Psalm 71:1-6

In you, O Lord, I take refuge;
let me never be put to shame.
In your righteousness deliver me and rescue me;
incline your ear to me and save me.
Be to me a rock of refuge,
a strong fortress, to save me,
for you are my rock and my fortress.

Rescue me, O my God, from the hand of the wicked, from the grasp of the unjust and cruel.

For you, O Lord, are my hope, my trust, O Lord, from my youth.

Upon you I have leaned from my birth; it was you who took me from my mother's womb.

My praise is continually of you. (NRSV)

We will never know what threat this particular psalmist was facing, but in some ways the specifics don't matter. His or her voice is all of our voices when we are in times of trouble. We seek refuge in the storm, a constant in the chaos, and hope in the midst of hopeless situations.

Tragically, our world today is filled with such situations—families struggling to feed their children, patients receiving frightening medical diagnoses, civilians caught in the crossfire of war, refugees uncertain of where they'll be able to rest their heads tonight, and far more. We have all known tragedy and hurt, whether it is firsthand, family or friends, or from strangers whose stories we have heard or seen. It is into a world of need that we too cry out like the psalmist, "Deliver us and rescue us; incline your ear to us and save us!"

Though we largely only speak about God's presence during times when we feel blessed, this psalm nevertheless powerfully asserts that God's presence isn't with us for a season or two but our entire life long. Written from the perspective of someone in their later years of life (see verse 9), the psalmist speaks of God's constant presence from the psalmist's birth to the present and beyond. Though there will be seasons in our lives when we can do little more than lament, God's presence, even in tragedy reminds us that we are never truly alone. For that, we can be thankful.

Our Annual Stone Soup Luncheon is planned for Sunday, March 3rd, during coffee hour.

We will need many hands to make this a successful event. For those of you who don't know the story of stone soup, it is this:

It tells the story of three hungry soldiers who come into a village and cleverly trick the peasants into sharing their food—by making a lavish soup out of seemingly nothing but stones. Like the soldiers' soup, this recipe turns basically whatever vegetables you have on hand into a hearty meal.

We are asking each of our Sunday school students to bring something for the soup. When you first arrive at church on March 3rd please bring your contribution to the kitchen prior to worship. The suggested items are:

Pre-K	1 medium onion, peeled and chopped
K	a clove of garlic, peeled and chopped
1	1 small cabbage, chopped or a cup of corn
2	3 small potatoes, peeled and chopped
3	3 carrots, peeled and chopped
4	1 stalk of celery, peeled and chopped
5	can of beans or a cup of pasta
6	sweet red pepper, chopped or zucchini or yellow squash

Anyone from the congregation that wishes to contribute a vegetable to the pot or a dessert to share is asked to bring it to the kitchen prior to service also.

As always, thank you all for your support. The magic of this event each year comes from the generosity of those who bring something for our soup pot. The soup is always a surprise treat that turns out great every year.



- § 4 cups toasted oat cereal
- § 1 can (6-1/2 oz.) peanuts*
- § 1 cup raisins
- 1/4-cup margarine
- \$ 1 package (6 oz.) semisweet chocolate chips
- @ plastic sandwich bags

How to make the treats:

- Mix the cereal, peanuts* and raisins in the large bowl.
- Melt the margarine in the small bowl using a microwave oven. (Please ask an adult to help with this step.)
- Pour the margarine over the cereal mixture.
- Use the fork to lightly toss the mixture until it's coated with margarine.
- Sprinkle the chocolate chips into the mixture and toss again.
- Spoon the mixture into the bags and share them with friends for a snack.

*Caution: Some people are very allergic to nuts. You can leave the peanuts out if you need to.
