Dear Goshen Presbyterian Church Family and Friends,

As you have learned, the Session concurred with my request not to renew my Interim Pastor covenant. My last Sunday sharing in worship with you will be May 28<sup>th</sup>. In case you are not part of our Google contact list, let me share with you the contents of the electronic letter I distributed. I am sure you know, this was not an easy decision to make.

I am grateful for your support and prayers, especially during these past 8 weeks of recovery from a broken leg. I will miss being a part of your worship and ministry and I will miss working with my faithful colleagues. I will also miss being a part of your lives. I so appreciate your welcoming me into the church two years ago and your dedication to walking with me during this time of congregational change.

The decision to move comes out of a season of prayerful discernment about next steps for Dave and me. But I will continue to pray for both the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and the Church as you move forward in calling a new Pastor. I have accepted a position as Interim Pastor to the First Presbyterian Church in Verona NJ and I do hope you will pray for me during this transition of service, as well.

I know that this news may come as something of a surprise to you, but temporary pastorates are intended to be precisely that—temporary. Your PNC is meeting weekly under the watchful supervision of John Miller, pastor of the Rye Presbyterian Church and member of the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry, and I have no fear that their due diligence will lead to the establishment of a new pastoral relationship before too long.

The Session and the Worship & Music Committee will seek to provide the congregation with effective worship leaders until new pastoral leadership is found. And I invite you to be in prayer for the elders as they work to make this time of transition as minimally disruptive as possible.

Between now and May 28<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate some special occasions together: Earth Day, a service in honor of the National Day of Prayer, Mother's Day, Confirmation, and Pentecost. There is much

celebrating to be done over the next six weeks, and I hope you will take advantage of our remaining time together.

I have every confidence in your future, and I will surely be cheering you on as you move toward a new pastoral relationship in the not-too-distant future!

I am so thankful for the honor of having served as your Interim Pastor and I look forward to seeing what God will be doing with you and through you as a community of faithful disciples in the months and years ahead. God bless you!

I write this on the Sunday after Easter. This morning, the choir (like the congregation!) was somewhat smaller than on Easter. Yet, with five singers, the anthem was an undoubted triumph. Several members of the congregation echoed my own thought: that the five sounded like fifteen. This has to do with technique. Singing correctly isn't all that hard to learn, and it yields wonderful—even at times magical—results.

So, bravos to the Mighty Five who sang the "Easter Carol" today.

However, my heart is also still full with gratitude and pride for the work of the choir and handbells during Palm Sunday and Easter. Their rehearsals were fun and inspiring, and their performances were stellar. Thank you and bravo, to each and every one of you.

I also appreciate the many expressions of appreciation voiced for the organ. Think about it: the last time we really had a Palm Sunday and Easter with the organ was 2019. We have missed it, and rightly so!

I want to say something about the words we use to describe music and musical styles. Often we hear a lament for music that is "lively," or "upbeat," or "uplifting," or "energetic." Usually, these are code words for "contemporary, guitar-and-drum-based, loud, fast, popular styles of music." The two things—energy and style—are totally different, of course. I play with energy!

Unfortunately, the "worship wars" are still with us, with a stubborn group still trying to score points for the 1960s, a smaller group looking to a specific period before that, and a third group—the one I am in—looking for continuity and balance.

I grew up in Manhattan in the Sixties, and my parents were strongly formed and came of age in the 1940s and 1950s. While I found the silliness and absurdity of the decade fun—think Soupy Sales (which I watched without grasping any of it), think the goofy *Batman* series—I also thrilled to the great mission of going to the moon. I remember vividly as the Apollo 11 astronauts touched down in the Sea of Tranquility and Neil Armstrong backed down the ladder. I also remember sit-ins and protests—my mother shepherding me firmly away from trouble more than once. I grew up a devoted childhood fan of Calvin Hampton, the "pied piper" young organist at Calvary Episcopal Church, which my dad attended. Many of us called it "Saint Calvin's Church" in our innocence.

I think I can see the two "sides" as clearly as anybody else.

If Jesus rose in the flesh, how dignified is the human body? And we make music with the body.

Let's start there.

If you would rather stay out of camera range, please know that we do not capture the seating under the balcony (on either side) and we don't capture the back rows at all. Regarding the Children's Message: We keep the camera zoomed out. As children leave to go to Sunday school, we will pan up to the stained glass windows so no children's faces are caught on camera.


