“Faith Matters”

“Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.” (Hebrews 13:8 NRSV)

Dear Friends in Christ,

If you were with us at worship on Sunday, you heard that we will be touching on themes of Renewal this Thanksgiving season. In fact, our Stewardship theme for this fall is:

ReNewing our Faith Together: ReConnect, ReEngage, ReCommit

There is a sense in the world today that, there are so many unknowns, we don't know which end is up or where to turn. There is division over whether, and how, to treat the COVID-19 virus. There are schisms at the Federal and State levels of government (over too many issues to touch on here). There is uncertainty at our jobs and in our neighborhoods. There are tears over our losses and prayers for our future. There is a hesitancy to trust in better days because we've been disappointed so many times already. And, perhaps, what feels like the most bitter pill of all is that the church—which was the one place we thought we could count on to be the same as we faced a “new normal”—was changing, too.

In truth, the only thing that remains the same over time is our precious Lord and Savior, and the love of God which is eternally at work bringing peace to an unsettled world and an anxious people.

As we know only too well, the world changes. Political parties come and go, as do agendas and the persons in charge. Our lives change, too—sometimes for good and sometimes not. Yes, and even the church changes—and must, if it is to meet the needs of those who come seeking God.

A good part of the reason you have an interim pastor at present is because the church is at a point in its history where a good look at who it is as the body of Christ is essential to a strong future and a growing ministry in his name. And another reason for having me join you as interim is that there is always a time of grieving when a long-time pastor leaves the fold; and that loss was only magnified by the disconnect experienced as a result of the pandemic. To jump into a “marriage” with a new pastor without doing the hard work first of assessment and planning could lead to a difficult result.

But that need to look forward doesn't mean that ministry grinds to a halt in the present day. Quite the opposite, in fact. Which is why transition specialists are called in to help congregations embrace their sacred work, both today and tomorrow. And why our work together must address the needs of a church in transition. Of course, in our case, those needs are compounded by the fallout from a destructive pandemic. Blessedly, you have good leaders who will guide the congregation during this essential time of recovery and planning for a new day.

At a recent meeting, your church leaders discussed the needs of the church going forward, and one of the topics we kept coming back to was the need for renewal—renewal of the heart, mind and soul—renewal of both the individual members that make this congregation great *and* of the whole community of faith that is the First Presbyterian Church in Goshen.

We agreed that we need to welcome a spiritual regeneration by ReConnecting with God and one another, ReEngaging the bible in new and artful ways, and ReCommitting our lives to the mission of this church as we seek—with God’s help—to change lives by reviving the passion we share as believers in Christ. We can’t do this work alone, however. And so, we are counting on your support and your participation as we move forward. We are looking to ReConnect through fellowship and mission. We are hoping to ReEngage through bible and book study, as well as special worship services designed to “stretch” us in meaningful ways and the Artful use of talents as expressions of faith. We are also seeking to ReCommit to Christ and this church through the generous pledging of our time, talent and treasure to accomplishing ReNewed lives.

We will keep you informed as this ministry of ReNewal unfolds over the coming year. Keep your eye out for announcements as they are released and make it a point to participate in as many of the offerings as possible. All this attention to spiritual renewal will only be as viable as our participation in it. See you at church!

Keep the clothing donations for men and women coming. As an FYI, we often supply clothing to our local community via the Goshen Ecumenical Food Pantry. We started doing this several months ago and it has been well received; the need is very real right here in Goshen, just not as obvious as it is in NYC.

Only 3 Niches Remain Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options:

Payment in Full = \$2,800

12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000)

18-Month Payment Option = \$180 / month for 18 months (\$3,240)

***We will need to consider constructing a 2nd and 3rd columbarium wall soon.
The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$40,000+.***

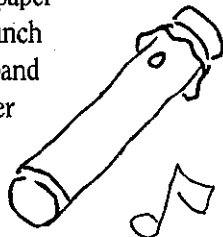

5. Hum into open end to play.

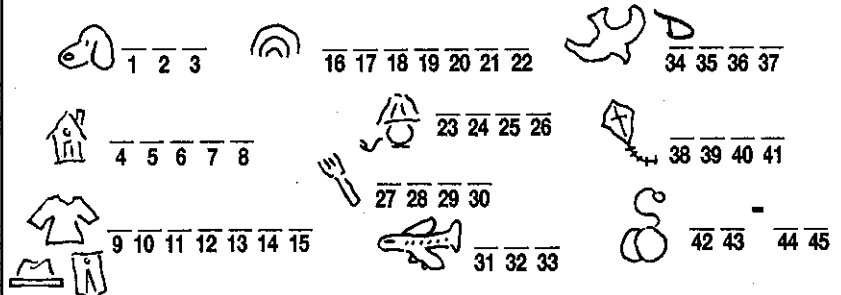
