"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13)

Dear Church Friends and Family,

As I write this, my husband and two of my sons are preparing their designs for the 5th Annual Myers Men Pumpkin Carving Contest. What started out as a simple project when my eldest grandson was 4, and we thought it would be fun for him to create his first jack-o-lantern, has turned into a competition to see who can design the greatest Halloween pumpkin of all. (Votes are tallied by Facebook posting.)

The women in the family get a kick out of watching the men carve away, trying so hard not to disclose their designs prior to the final reveal and muttering as they "tweak" their unwieldy delights. There is everything you might expect from game contestants: bravado, laughter, mumbling, and a marvelous exhibition of competitive spirit.

While this may sound like a funny intro to a pastor's letter, I lift it up because this tradition has now become a part of our family life and we look forward to this fall event with joy. The planning starts over the summer and by Labor Day, the date has been chosen and put on our collective calendar, and nothing—not even a Progressive Dinner—can stand in the way of our little contest coming to fruition because all the "competitors" make a commitment to one another: to be present, to bring their talents and their best humor, and to share in some great fun and even a bit of bravado.

Of course, there are times in life when commitments have to change, and that may someday be the case for our Annual Pumpkin Carving Contest. But, in truth, a healthy family values its commitments and works to fulfill them, to the best of their ability. And that speaks to the men I love, and to the women who stand on the sidelines laughing, sharing stories, and participating through their own supportive jests and "suggestions."

Healthy church families value their commitments, too. And, as Christians of the Presbyterian persuasion, there are certain commitments to which we hold fast lest they be neglected or, worse yet, forgotten. Some of the commitments we make upon becoming communicant members of the church that are vital to the unity and well-being of the body of Christ include the following; we commit to:

• Letting our leaders lead, and not just manage, our church affairs. This is vitally important during a time of transition when church identity, systems, and values are all being reviewed and—where necessary—updated for a new season of church life. Of course, we are best able to

join in God's mission in Goshen and around the world when we uphold the shared leadership of our Session and Deacons—who don't do ministry for the rest of us but lead us in doing the Lord's work. To accomplish this work of leadership, they need your support, encouragement, prayers, and a willingness to go along for the journey!

- Caring for the church community like a family. We make our promises to one another, put dates on a calendar, welcome leadership roles, plan events, participate in worship and education, take a hand in mission support, and show our care when others are struggling—all while loving, laughing, encouraging , and sharing with one another as we make and tell our stories of faith.
- Sharing our gifts of every stripe—*spiritual, financial, artistic, linguistic, educational, and more.* During this season of Thanksgiving, I urge you to especially consider your financial gifts to the church. Sometime over the coming year, you will call and install a new pastor. To make that relationship work, you will need to make provisions for salary support and housing. And you will need to be open to sharing your talents, your hope, and your unique self to this family of faith so that the work of the church continues on without a lapse in leadership. And we know what happens when sharing is done well: everyone knows we are Christians by our love.
- Respecting one another, even those with whom we may disagree, all the while working for unity in the body as we courageously march into the future with a decision to be transparent about our beliefs, open to mutual dialogue, speaking the truth in love, harboring no secrets, and holding no grudges.

There may be times when we think we know what's best and we speak with some bravado, hoping to come out on top and win the prize of most righteous disciple. But we all know that, in the end, all bluster aside, the unity we share as a family in Christ must always be the goal. There are no separate agendas, only God's will for the church divine.

I am so enjoying being your Interim Pastor and I hope you will re-commit to your church family this fall, trusting that Christ is always with us giving us courage and hope for tomorrow. Even when life throws challenges our way, may we trust and believe that the Lord's strength and love will carry us through.

And for those of you on Facebook, look for the pumpkins!

New choir members are welcome. You might consider coming to a few rehearsals and taking part in Christmas, if a longer commitment isn't feasible.


Handbells will resume early in November to prepare for the holidays as well.


The Prayer Shawl Ministry

A GUIDELINE FOR CHURCH MEMBERS ATTENDING SESSION MEETINGS

All members of the congregation of the First Presbyterian Church in Goshen are welcome to attend general meetings of the Session which are currently held in Fellowship Hall on the third Wednesday of each month beginning at 7 p.m.

If you attend a Session meeting to express concern for a topic that is before the Session, please let both the Clerk and the Moderator know of your desire to speak prior to the start of the meeting. The Moderator will inform the Session at the appropriate time that you would like to address the Session and that request must be moved/seconded and passed before you may speak. Please limit the time you use being as brief as possible. If, following your comment, any Session member wishes more information concerning what you have offered, they will ask.

The only portion of a meeting where you might be asked to step out is during discussion of sensitive matters concerning the church and/or where there is a concern for confidentiality. This should not be seen as an affront in any manner but is there for the best interest of the Session and congregation.

Church members should not interrupt the proceedings of the Session with personal questions or concerns. After the adjournment of the Session, the Moderator and Clerk will be happy to address your questions.
