FROM THE PRESBYTERY....

Policy for Pastors and Churches Concluding a Pastoral Relationship

When a pastoral position with a congregation ends, there are bonds of affection between the minister and members of the church that continue to be cherished. Relations of friendship continue, but the pastoral relationship does not. In order to avoid awkward situations and to encourage the new pastoral relationship that will be established, the Presbytery establishes the following guidelines.

"When a pastor resigns from a pastorate, retires from service or becomes Pastor Emerita/us, that minister shall no longer perform pastoral functions, such as weddings, baptisms, funerals, hospital visitations or counseling. Active or inactive church members should not request a former pastor to perform pastoral duties. If requested, the pastor shall tactfully decline.

There shall be no more visits of a pastoral nature after the effective date of dissolution of the pastorate, now shall there be visits to the worship service on the part of the now former pastor."

This policy is implemented in order to provide for the maximum degree of protection and the minimum of intrusion possible to a new pastoral relationship, in order that the new pastor's opportunities for service and growth with the congregation may be advanced at every possible opportunity.

WORSHIP SERVICES

Worship services will continue on the lawn, while weather permits. We hope you can join us in Church Park at 9:30 a.m. Sundays. Bring your own lawn chair and sit with us out in the sunshine or under the shade trees. We ask that you continue to wear face masks and that you observe social distancing.

We also provide worship services on "YouTube" that have been pre-recorded earlier in the week. These services can be accessed at 9:30 a.m. Sundays and then throughout the week. If you've missed earlier services, you can still find them on "YouTube."

We plan to provide a variety of worship leaders. They are all from the Presbytery's Pulpit Supply List and have been approved by its Commission on Ministry. Some will be entirely new voices to you. We hope you welcome their messages.

Memorial Pavers

To order a memorial paver to honor or remember your loved ones, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is only \$100. We will place an order when we have 10 requests (as of now we only have one order).

Only 4 Niches Remain Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options: **Payment in Full = \$2,800** 12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000)

18-Month Payment Option = $\frac{180}{\text{month for 18 months}}$

We will need to consider constructing a 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} columbarium wall soon. The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$40,000+.

You will need:


- a 2" x 5" strip of construction paper

- paper punch





1. Punch 3 rows of 6 holes each as shown.
