"Faith Matters"

"The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." (Mark 1:1)

Dear Friends in Christ,

Mark is believed to be the oldest of the 4 gospels and, quite likely, written in haste so that the good news of Jesus Christ would not be forgotten. Because of its inherent urgency, Mark is written in a rapid-fire manner to tell the story of God's Son, who is always *on the move*. Mark's first sentence plunges us *immediately* into the earthly ministry of Jesus, who is estimated to have walked over 1,000 miles a year in each of his 3 years of ministry.

Jesus planned to reach as many people as possible with the good news of an ever-present God who loves unconditionally and cares for all the beloved children without regard to those things that culture uses to segregate people: race, gender identification, wealth, politics, social standing, education level, vocation, etc. This gospel is a record of Jesus' non-stop activity to *get the word out;* which may be why Mark uses the word "immediately" over 40 times to describe the Lord at work, engaging and serving the people while simultaneously involving his followers in worship and mission.

Jesus describes himself as a servant acting on God's behalf to ease suffering, advance the Kingdom and *transform lives*. And his constant interaction with the people of Galilee, Judea and beyond help us see the importance of revealing God's presence to a broken and hurting world.

In the Great Commission, at the end of Matthew's gospel, we are instructed to "make disciples of all nations" through the witness of our lives and by the power of the Holy Spirit within us. We are called to reach out, to touch lives, to connect with others in the name of Jesus and to prayerfully and intentionally share the fruits of spiritual intimacy with others so that the world might begin to see the joy of Christ shining through us as, together, we travel *along the way*.

There is no better time than right now, as an ugly pandemic and political partisanship threaten the peace and unity of God's children, to be disciples on a mission of sharing Christ with the world. To do this is to *be the church*, acting together, on the move with Jesus, helping our community discover, follow and worship the Lord whose passion and mission we dare to share.

There is a story at the end of Luke's gospel about 2 dispirited disciples walking home from Jerusalem to Emmaus, talking about the recent events surrounding Jesus' death. They are joined by a stranger who gradually reveals his identity to them. Luke tells us that Jesus draws near and accompanies them *on their journey* and that, at supper, he breaks the bread and they recognize his presence fully. In that moment of discovery, their lives are *transformed* and they choose to follow the One who continues to

be on the move, sharing the Good News of a life-changing incarnate love with the world.

This fall, in our worship, we will consider what it means to be a church *on the move*, bringing joy, love, unity and energy to a world that is dispirited by a COVID downturn and too much political wrangling. "Being Church Together," we will explore the blessings of discipleship as we:

- *be*hold the Lord.
- belong to a community which bears his name, and
- *be*come more and more the disciples he urges us to be.

We may not walk a thousand miles with Jesus this year, friends, but we can certainly follow along the way of the Lord, wherever it may take us. I hope you will join us this fall as we celebrate Christ and show the world why faith matters! For we are the church reformed, and always reforming.

However, *please be sure your spouse or partner and all young adults living in your home have an opportunity to complete the survey.* INDIVIDUAL INPUT is key to our gaining insight into overall perceptions and experiences.

Please set aside enough time to answer all the questions. This will take about 20 minutes of your time. All survey responses are strictly anonymous.

Thank you for your willingness to be a part of this congregational assessment and for helping to build the church's future. Please also plan on joining us for the Interpretation of our survey responses with a consultant from Crows Feet Consulting on Saturday, September 11th.

Memorial Pavers

To order a memorial paver to honor or remember your loved ones, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is only \$100. We will place an order when we have 10 requests (as of now we only have one order).

Only 3 Niches Remain Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options:

Payment in Full = \$2,800

12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000) 18-Month Payment Option = \$180 / month for 18 months (\$3,240)

We will need to consider constructing a 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} columbarium wall soon. The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$40,000+.

Make a 🏈 "Prayer Pretzel"



Pretzels were first made by monks in Rome during the 5th century. The shape looks like a person's arms folded in prayer. You can make your own pretzels.

You will need:


- A roll of refrigerated bread stick dough
- (A) One egg yolk
- 11/2 tablespoons of milk
- Cookie sheet
- Coarse salt





How to make them:

- Shape each piece of dough into a pretzel shape.
- Place on cookie sheet.
- Brush with a mixture of the egg yolk and milk.
- Sprinkle with salt.
 (You can use parmesan cheese, if you prefer.)
- Bake according to package directions.
