"Faith Matters: Embracing the Future"

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans...to give you a future with hope."

(Jeremiah 29:11 NRSVue*)

My dear Goshen Presbyterian Friends,

I hope this summer has been a good one for you and that you've come to this Fall season refreshed and ready to begin a new year of hope-filled discipleship. Our Christian Education and Music programs begin anew this month, and our Sunday worship will be expanded again to include a third hymn and a Children's Message. Singing, Ringing, and Engaging the Spirit through prayer and the preached Word always brings us such joy when we worship together as one body united in Christ.

And, as part of that united body, you know that a Transition Team was elected by the Session earlier this year for a time of discernment and planning. The Team was charged with reflecting on the church's readiness for ministry in a new era and making recommendations regarding the church's ministry that will, with God's help, support the work of an eventual Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

The Transition Team has studied the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) Report in depth, met bi-weekly with a church consultant provided us by the Presbytery of Hudson River, and engaged in wide-ranging conversations about the congregation's history, theology, ideology, and identity as a Presbyterian community of faith. The Team has also conducted Table-Top Conversations with members at Coffee Hour regarding topics vital to being the church at work in the world today and has conducted videotaped interviews of congregants willing to share their deep connection to the Goshen church.

The Team has taken what they've learned from you, and what they've gleaned by the Holy Spirit through its conversations with you and each other, and has begun to prepare a Report that is intended to be the foundation for the PNC's Ministry Information Form used in seeking your next pastor. Excited to be nearing the end of its process, the Team would like to include you in a large-group conversation about a vision for the church's ministry going forward.

So, you are being invited to join the Transition Team for a catered luncheon in the Fellowship Hall following worship on Sunday, September 25th. The theme for the day will be:

Embracing Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow: A Forum to Share Experiences and Ideas

After sharing a meal, the Team will highlight the congregation's history and show how that history has helped shape our identity as a Presbyterian congregation. The Team will also report on shared experiences, show some of those videotaped interviews, present a preliminary oral report on its work, and invite conversation about the congregation's future ministry. Your participation in this event is vital to the success of the Transition Team in producing a Report that is both useful and meaningful to a forthcoming PNC.

Through the prophets and saints, the Lord has assured us that there is hope for a future that is God-given. The Transition Team and I pray that you'll want to be a part of that future as it applies to the church and that you'll assist us in taking next steps by being part of this upcoming conversation. And, good news, there's a luncheon provided, too!

A Thank You Note from Church World Service for Supporting Blanket Drive

"There are no words to explain how good it is to do online lessons in a special space dedicated to us."

Reading that quote from a Ukrainian refugee child made my heart smile, and I wanted to take a moment to let you know how thankful I am for your support of CWS Tools and Blankets. Each time your congregation hosts an event you offer hope to someone feeling hopeless. Like the thousands of Ukrainian families who fled to Moldova after Russia's unprovoked attack. Lives were turned upside down—especially for Ukrainian refugee children who left behind their school, friends and the only life they've ever known.

But because of your compassionate action, children and their families have hope. Through our partnership with the local organization, Diaconia, we've created ways to help refugee children feel safe and regain a sense of normalcy. Through the Refugee Hub, children have education and mental health

support. And it's making a BIG difference. We have also shipped our local partner a large shipping container of supplies that includes: 2,000 wool blankets, 1,200 school kits, 12,000 hygiene kits and 375 baby care kits!

Memorial Pavers

To order a memorial paver to honor or remember your loved ones, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is only \$100. We will place an order when we have 10 requests (as of now we have **FIVE** orders).

Only ONE Niche Remains Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Each niche allows for double or single interment with three purchase options:

Payment in Full = \$2,800

12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000)

18-Month Payment Option = \$180 / month for 18 months (\$3,240)

We will need to consider constructing a 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} columbarium wall soon. The estimated cost for these two new walls is \$50,000.




