Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Mark 8:1-10

In those days when there was again a great crowd without anything to eat, he called his disciples and said to them, "I have compassion for the crowd, because they have been with me now for three days and have nothing to eat. If I send them away hungry to their homes, they will faint on the way—and some of them have come from a great distance." His disciples replied, "How can one feed these people with bread here in the desert?" He asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" They said, "Seven." Then he ordered the crowd to sit down on the ground; and he took the seven loaves, and after giving thanks he broke them and gave them to his disciples to distribute; and they distributed them to the crowd. They had also a few small fish; and after blessing them, he ordered that these too should be distributed. They are and were filled; and they took up the broken pieces left over, seven baskets full. Now there were about four thousand people. And he sent them away. And immediately he got into the boat with his disciples and went to the district of Dalmanutha.

I can be easily overwhelmed by going on one of our Midnight Runs or even exiting a parking lot in Middletown or Newburgh. I see people sleeping in every covered spot I pass. As I walk around, there is a person asking for something on every corner. It can be so overwhelming that it is tempting to assume there isn't anything that I can do to help anyone. There is so much need and I am only one person.

Like the disciples, I am quick to think about the challenges regarding a situation and take more thought and effort to get to creative solutions. "How can one feed these people with bread here in the desert?" I relate, "How can my change make a difference in a person's situation?"

What if instead of questioning the challenges we face, I gave willingly whatever I had and trusted that God will use that to the greatest purpose. I don't need all the answers before I participate in the solution; all I need is to give willingly. Trust God with the details, there may be a solution that defies everything I think is logical.

TEN WAYS TO SUPPORT HABITAT FOR HUMANITY OF GREATER NEWBURGH

- **Donate to the Restore** (38 S. Plank Rd. in Newburgh). They will even pick up your donations of used furniture, working appliances or building materials. Or shop the Restore and find great stuff and awesome deals. Or help run the store by volunteering a few hours a week. The Restore is a great revenue source for Habitat.
- **Join the Annual Walk for Housing.** Walk to raise funds, form a walker team from your church, from among your friends and family or your co-workers. It's Sunday, April 22, and starts from Washington's Headquarters. Registration is at 12:30. Walk starts at 1:30. It's a 3-mile walk that will take you past about 50 of the 90 homes built by Habitat. There is always music along the way.
- **Be a Walk Volunteer** Serve on next year's Walk Planning Committee or volunteer to help out the day of the walk. (In April the Volunteer Hub on Habitat Newburgh's website will list the jobs you can sign-up for.)
- **Volunteer at this year's Builder's Blitz** where Habitat partners with local builders to build two houses in five days. Fascinating to watch! Work in the Hospitality Tent a few hours a day serving coffee and food to the local builders. The Builder's Blitz is June 4th through the 8th. (Sign up on the Volunteer Hub)
- **Join our 19**th **Annual Golf Fore Housing**. The Golf Classic is held at the Powelton Club, a beautiful private country club in historic Newburgh. Register to play or become a sponsor. It's May 21.
- Take a Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood Bus Tour. It's free and you will visit work sites and ride past some of the 90 houses built by Habitat while learning the history or Habitat Newburgh.
- **Donate a car**, whether it's running or not, Habitat can turn your car donation into cash.
- **Join a Committee** that helps find qualified home ownership applicants or a committee that mentors families as they go through the home ownership program.
- Work on Site. Sites are open to volunteers from 8 am to 1 pm on Wednesdays and Saturdays. There are always several open sites. All skill levels are welcome but you must register and sign up on the Volunteer Hub first.
- **Specifically for Women.** Join National Women Build Week it's May 7-11 this year. Sites will be open all week. You'll meet a lot of fabulous women. Register on the Volunteer Hub.
