#### From the Pastor's Desk....

I need to say a very special thank you to everyone for the warm welcome I have been extended since coming onboard here at Goshen; so much overwhelming acceptance for myself and my wife Lauren. We are very grateful. The Christmas Season is upon us; our busy time in the church and in our personal lives. For those of us who are not really feeling jolly at this time, there will be a Blue Christmas Service at Scotchtown on Saturday, December 21<sup>st</sup> @ 7:00 PM. Everyone is welcome.

1 John 3:13, 'Do not be surprised, brothers, that the world hates you.'

Should we, as Christians be surprised from the onslaught of evil targeting of Christ, Christianity, and the Church? From the subtle to the 'in your face' demonic presentation of the Super Bowl half time shows, to the blatant blasphemy of the opening ceremonies of the 2024 Olympics and the perverted use of gender to have an advantage in the Olympics, there is no doubt to any rational person that Jesus Christ is in the crosshairs of a real devil, real demons, and people who hate Christ. So again, should we be surprised? The Bible communicates that we shouldn't be surprised. The world system and those who are in it hate God and hate the people of God.

Mark 16:15, 'And He (Jesus) said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the Gospel to the whole creation."

**1 Corinthians 15:3-4,** For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures,'

**1 Corinthians 4:1-2**, 'This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful.'

## Please Pay Your Per Capita Assessment For 2024

A message from the Treasurer: Please consider paying your per capita assessment for 2024 to offset the more than \$8,000 the church must pay out to cover expenses for the Presbytery of Hudson River, Synod of the Northeast and General Assembly of Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This year it remains at \$39.75 per member (not per family). Please assist with this expense and write a check for your family assessment and either mail it to the church or place it in the Sunday offering plate. We ask that you pay this by February 1, 2024. Thank you for doing your share to support the expense of being a church in active ministry.

The Live Stream camera generally captures the first 4-5 (rarely 7-8) rows of the sanctuary in its feed. Normally we only see the back of your head. If you would rather stay out of camera range, please know that we do not capture the seating under the balcony (on either side) and we don't capture the back rows at all. Regarding the Children's Message: We keep the camera zoomed out. As children leave to go to Sunday school, we will pan up to the stained glass windows so no children's faces are caught on camera.

#### How to do:

Trace the circle on two cards. Cut out and glue the backs of the cards together.

Punch a hole in the top. Insert a piece of yarn or ribbon.
