Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

And a sword will pierce your own soul, too. (Luke 2:35)

Simeon had been dead for decades.

Not that Mary knew this. The biblical text gives us no reason to believe that Mary actually knew anything about Simeon's death. Our imaginations allow Simeon to walk away after speaking his prophetic word of blessing over the infant Jesus. Perhaps one night he went to bed, falling into a long-promised sleep from which he would never wake.

Simeon had been dead for decades—but what he had spoken to Mary had lived on. His foreboding words had echoed in her mind time and time again. "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul, too." (Luke 2:34-35)

Then came a dark day when Mary remembered it all again. She remembered his wrinkled hands reaching for her son. She saw again his moist eyes and weathered face raised to heaven in gratitude. She felt again her momentary fear as this man had taken her son into his arms. She heard the words as if they had been spoken last week: "And a sword will pierce your own soul, too." And standing on a hill not far from that Jerusalem temple, watching the agony of her child, she felt the sword pierce deep.

In recent days, we have felt it, too: the violent stab of loss. With every image from Newtown, with every detail of that Friday in Advent, the piercing blade of anguish and anger and speechless sorrow has pressed deep into our souls. In some ways, the grief is made especially bitter by the season. The sights and sounds of Christmas, making children of us all, cannot contain this horror. How could this happen, and how could it happen now?

And yet, Christmas is our only source of hope. Perhaps we have made the birth of Jesus too soft and glowing. We must now say clearly and boldly what happened in Bethlehem: God entered our world. Not the world we wish we lived in, but the world we actually inhabit. The empathy of God, God's embrace of our world, will be our focus this week.

Simeon's prophetic words to Mary remind us where all of this is going. This child is the dividing line of history. He will be adored and spoken against, believed and rejected. He will be a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. That includes your sorrow and your grief.

Christmas reminds us that there is nothing we have lived through or ever will live through that our God does not know. God knows it from the inside. Christmas is also a calling. God may be asking you to enter into someone else's sorrow and grief in this season of the year and in the year we now are entering.

How will you do that today?

Join Us at the Community Dinner

The Mission Committee is extending an invitation to parishioners to come and eat with us at the next community dinner on Saturday, January 12. Dining will begin at 5:30 p.m.

It's going to be a special night because Rev. Lise Worthington, pastor of the Blooming Grove United Church of Christ, will be attending and bringing chefs with her to cook up some fresh, frozen vegetables.

Reverend Worthington will talk about the "Graze on Faith" project, which makes available to you fresh, frozen vegetables from November through February or March. Here's how it works: You sign up and pay for a share, and Reverend Worthington delivers the food to the church on the second Saturday of each month. Each person who signs up receives seven cellophane bags of frozen vegetables per month, and the food pantry then receives a matching seven bags to distribute. The cost is \$125 for four months and \$150 for five months. Reverend Worthington can fully explain the project and answer all your questions.

Please make every effort to attend this community dinner so you can listen to Reverend Worthington and enjoy a full turkey or ham dinner that will include plenty of fresh vegetables and, of course, many homemade desserts.

Memorial Pavers

An order for nine new engraved pavers has been placed. These pavers will be installed in the spring. To order a memorial paver for later next year to honor or remember a loved one, please see Pat in the church office. The cost of each paver is \$100.

Niches are Available for Purchase in the Memorial Columbarium

Fifteen niches remain available in the memorial columbarium. Each niche allows for double or single interment with four purchase options:

Payment in Full = \$2,500 12-Month Payment Option = \$250 / month for 12 months (\$3,000) 24-Month Payment Option = \$130 / month for 24 months (\$3,120) 36-Month Payment Option = \$90 / month for 36 months (\$3,240)
