Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Are You Settling for Less?

I recently ran a search on the word "settle" on dictionary.com. What I found was a very thorough list of the senses or possible uses and meanings of the word. No surprises, really. "Settle" can mean "to take up residence in a certain place"; it can mean "to pay a bill or account"; it can mean "causing something to be established." Dictionary.com gave a list of thirty-two possible uses of the word. The one which holds my interest was number thirty-one: "To be satisfied with."

This is the kind of settling we generally don't like. Paying a bill, settling into a new home, reaching agreement on an issue or question, getting the kids to sit still in the back seat—these are forms of settling that we gladly embrace. But to simply "be satisfied" doesn't quite cut it. That's the kind of settling we refuse to do.

Some of you are still single today because you've decided you don't want to "settle."

Some of you are quietly doctoring your resume because you don't want to "settle" professionally.

Some of you are negotiating a business deal, and you want to be careful not to "settle" too quickly or too low.

Some of you are stressed and anxious because you can't settle; nothing is ever enough. Others of you live every day with mild sense of regret. You look back at your life and you wonder if that's your story...you "settled."

Few of us aspire to "settle" in this sense—and yet, when it comes to the spiritual fruit of joy, that's exactly what we do. We settle. Since we're not clear about the nature of joy, we settle for something less. We may settle for being successful, but success isn't joy. We may constantly chase fun, but having fun doesn't mean we find joy. We may settle for being well liked or popular, but having friends doesn't always bring joy. In a variety of ways, we can settle for something less than or other than the spiritual fruit of joy. We trade our joy for something that makes us feel good. It's a lousy exchange.

Jesus—the very Jesus who lives in us by the Holy Spirit—would tell us, "Don't settle." In fact, Jesus intended that we would have joy and that our joy would be full. He said so, and he said it plainly: "These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full" (John 15:11).

Are you allowing yourself to "settle" for something less than the fullness of joy Jesus wants to give you? If your joy is something less than full, what is occupying that space? What is your "joy substitute" of choice?

Hug Happenings News of the Prayer Shawl Ministry (PSM)

Our shawls continue to be sent out to warm the souls of those who need a little hugging. Some of the recent shawls donated to the "shawl closet" are so beautiful it seems a sin to have to tuck them away. But in time, they all seem to find shoulders that need them and love them as much as the makers who created them did.

Recently, I visited a friend in the Schervier Pavilion in Warwick. I noticed that there were many people, especially ladies, sitting in wheelchairs wearing thin cotton dresses with their legs exposed. While this is not only a nursing home but also a rehab center, I asked the lady at the desk if they have a lot of full-time residents. She told me that they had many and quite a few without any family left.

A week later, I delivered a dozen of our lap robes and shawls to them. The lady at the desk was so impressed with our work, she had tears in her eyes. She immediately pulled one of the shawls and walked to the reception area where a woman in a wheelchair was visiting with her husband. It was obvious that the lady was a stroke victim, but she could say a few words. The lady from the front desk put the shawl around her, and she immediately began stroking it and smiled at me. She made it known that "no one was to steal it from her room," and I saw the look of thanks in those crystal blue eyes.

With the gifts, I enclosed some of our prayers and a letter stating who we are and what we do. They said they were going to give it to the pastoral care committee at the home, as they would know who would need and appreciate them.

I have to admit that, for the entire day, I had a smile on my face and a good feeling that I wanted to share with all our PSM workers. It was a rainy Tuesday, and a few hours after I left them, I stopped the car at a red light. When I looked in my rearview mirror, I saw a magnificent rainbow. I think it was God's way of saying that he thanked us, too, for taking care of his people.

Have a wonderful and blessed summer. We are making a difference, and, just so you know, we are very close to the one-thousand-mark of gifts we have given since we began in September of 2007.
