Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me . . . (Matt. 28:18)

In my mind Jesus' Great Commission has forever began with the word "go."

If I were to try and say those words by memory, that's where I would start. And I would very likely slip into the Elizabethan English of the King James Bible; "Go ye." That's how I learned those words, soaking them in throughout my childhood in Sunday school classes and Vacation Bible Schools and sermons and songs.

Somehow in my mind the great commission became the great go-mission.

But every time I open the Bible and actually read the words that Jesus spoke, I'm confronted with my error. Jesus is already speaking before he gets to the word 'go.' If we begin with 'go' we're late to the party and what we miss out on just might be critical for how we go or whether we go at all.

"All authority in heaven and one earth has been given to me."

This is the opening line of the great commission. Jesus doesn't begin with us and what we do. He begins with himself and who he is, his authority over all things in heaven and on earth.

We can think about this in a couple of ways. For starters, Jesus' statement about his authority sounds like it compels our obedience to his command to go and make disciples. Since Jesus has authority, we need to take seriously what he says. And if he says 'go,' we go.

But there is a different way that authority works in our lives, and this may be what Jesus wants us to know. His authority over all things doesn't simply compel obedience, it fills us with confidence. Without this confidence we will not go and carry out his mission.

If we skip this opening line and begin with 'go' we are likely to go in our own authority. And when we take on a spiritual calling in our own authority, things get weird. We become pushy. We do violence to others. We are not relaxed. We find it hard to love. We neglect prayer.

There is plenty to talk about when it comes to the word 'go.' What does going look like? Where does going lead us? These are good questions, but they are not a good beginning. Unless we are convinced that Jesus is indeed alive and actively accomplishing his will in this world, we will not go at all.

Maybe as you read this you're getting ready to go somewhere. Today, before you go, take a moment and give thanks to Jesus for his authority over all things. The decisions you're facing at work, the parenting tasks that consume your thoughts, the errands you need to run and the people you'll encounter – Jesus has authority over all of those things. He is already at work in those places and his commission is an invitation to join him there.

So go. But before you go, rest in his authority. And pay attention. Wherever you go, Jesus is already there.

MARCH STARTS OUR LENTEN OBSERVANCE



We continue the rhythm of the liturgical year as we live through the life of Jesus the Christ in his life-changing ministry on Earth. We begin the first Sunday in March with the **Transfiguration of the Lord** in which we recall how Jesus and three of his apostles go to a mountain, and Jesus begins to shine with bright rays of light. Then, the prophets Moses and Elijah appear next to him, and he speaks with them. He shows his disciples a glimpse of his heavenly glory.

We move immediately to **Ash Wednesday** on March 5. It is at this time we stop to reflect upon our mortal condition and to hear those familiar words, "Remember, from dust you are and to dust you shall return." We come with penitent hearts indicating our desire to search our hearts and change our lives. We humble ourselves and receive the ashes in the shape of a cross on our foreheads reminding us of the good news of the gospel – forgiveness for all and life in Christ.



We leave and go back out into the world ready to do our soul searching in a positive way taking stock of our lives, our shortcomings, our separation from God and his will for our lives. It is during this time that we can make changes in how we live in relationship with God, ourselves, and with others. The season of Lent is a time to set things right.

Our chancel choir will be supporting our Lenten journey with anthems to help us along the way. On Ash Wednesday we offer this sung prayer:

Search me, O God, and know my heart today; Try me, O Savior, know my thoughts, I pray. See if there be some wicked way in me; Cleanse me from every sin and set me free.

Lord, take my life, and make it wholly thine; Fill my poor heart with thy great love divine. Take all my will, my passion, self and pride; I now surrender, Lord, In me abide.

YOU MAY BE ASKED TO SERVE

Spring is coming and we will be filling vacancies on our Board of Deacons and Session for 2014-2017. If you are asked by a member of your church Nominating Committee to serve, we would hope that you will give their request your prayerful consideration.

Below are some of the responsibilities of Session Elders and Deacons (this is not a complete list). Attendance and participation at meetings is essential.

ELDERS – A ministry of discernment and governance.

The Session is responsible for the mission and government of the church. It is responsible to the congregation. It is composed of the Pastor who acts as Moderator and 18 Elders serving three-year terms. The Session meets at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Wednesday of each month.

Each Elder is assigned to serve on a committee. There is a Moderator and Vice-Moderator (Session members) for each committee, appointed by the Pastor and confirmed by the Session. These committees are also made up of active members of the congregation. Committees meet monthly.

Elders are asked to serve on one of the following standing committees of Session.

- Worship & Music
- Christian Education
- Mission
- Outreach/Fellowship
- Property Management
- Finance & Administration

Elders are also expected to prepare and serve communion six months of the year, alternating with the Deacons.

DEACONS – A ministry of compassion and service.

The office of Deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of sympathy, witness and service after the example of Jesus Christ. It is responsible to the Session for the welfare, oversight and relief of the needy and overall service to the church and its members. It is composed of 21 members, and lead by a moderator who is chosen by the group. Deacons meet once a month following worship service.

The Deacons prepare the sanctuary for all worship services. That includes taking care of the church linens and candles, polishing the brass, preparing the baptismal font, serving as ushers (also at funerals) and preparing and serving communion, alternating months with the Session.

The Deacons traditionally provide Palm Sunday Breakfast, host a congregational picnic in June and green the church in December. They also raise funds for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund for people in need.
