It's been a long journey, but we seem to be settling down for a while. I'm looking forward to a time of growth and stability. I hope you are too! Please join choir and/or handbells—and come to the Tuesday recitals—and bring friends!

Did you ever read *The Peterkin Papers*, by Lucretia Hale? Hale was a Massachusetts native, living from 1820 to 1900. She remained a beloved children's writer long beyond her nineteenth-century milieu. I grew up on the East Side of Manhattan in the 1960s and read about her imaginary Peterkin family with delight.

The Peterkin Papers is about a sincere but befuddled Philadelphia family. They never do seem to get anything quite right, from untying a horse to writing a novel to learning languages. As a young boy going to the Epiphany School on East 22nd Street, I loved reading about this far-away but amusing and understandable family! I got my copy from Junior Delux Editions, Garden City, NY—a company that sold books to school children on a subscription basis. Maybe you have some too! My copy is right on my shelf, still in nearly-new condition.

It strikes me that, today, we have largely lost our connection to books. By reading, I found the Victorian Era as close to me as President Johnson and the Vietnam War...if not closer. I found that there is a form of language that lives in books, distinct from, and usually better than, the shorthand we spoke on the playground. Personal memories are like the nuclear family—aching for expansion!

Without a literary tradition, I think, we become barbarians, hardly able to express ourselves beyond biological needs. We forget things we shouldn't. Why does this happen?

Who's afraid of an old book? Could it be that old books teach us good values? And what about *the* Book?

Our hymn tradition conveys perennial values as well...and without musical literacy, without a mind to cherish the good old music, we lose something of ourselves. Music deflates into a three-chord grind of commercial nothing...a far cry from the spiritual longings of Bach and Mozart, Watts and Wesley. Sure, a bit of a mixture can be fun, but what does "mixture" mean?

As I said, I lived in the 60s—I think I know the answer to that question. "Mixture" can only mean a robust tradition continuing and expanding...it can't mean "replacement."

So let's stick with our glorious hymn tradition, cherish it, take it on board, "read, mark, and inwardly digest" it—and be much the happier for it. Tradition isn't the worship of ashes, but the protection of a living flame. At least, that's how I see it!

See you in church...Sundays, Tuesdays, Thursdays...anytime!

A message from the Treasurer: Please consider paying your per capita assessment for 2024 to offset the more than \$8,000 the church must pay out to cover expenses for the Presbytery of Hudson River, Synod of the Northeast and General Assembly of Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This year it remains at \$39.75 per member (not per family). Please assist with this expense and write a check for your family assessment and either mail it to the church or place it in the Sunday offering plate. We ask that you pay this by February 1, 2024. Thank you for doing your share to support the expense of being a church in active ministry.

Please Be Advised That We Do Live Stream Our Worship Services.

The Live Stream camera generally captures the first 4-5 (rarely 7-8) rows of the sanctuary in its feed. Normally we only see the back of your head. If you would rather stay out of camera range, please know that we do not capture the seating under the balcony (on either side) and we don't capture the back rows at all. Regarding the Children's Message: We keep the camera zoomed out. As children leave to go to Sunday school, we will pan up to the stained glass windows so no children's faces are caught on camera.

PLEASE NOTE: A niche in the Memorial Columbarium has become available. If you are interested in purchasing it, please contact Pat in the church office.

The price of the niche is \$2,800. There are two payment options:

12 month = \$250/month for 12 months (\$3,000)

18 month = \$180/month for 1 month (\$3,240)

Once this niche is sold, the Session/Congregation will need to consider if constructing a second/third wall is desired and/or financially possible. If it is, a new estimate for the work will need to be created, considered, approved and project timeline established.


/ ake a bookmark to mark your favorite Bible verse

- glue




■ paper punch
